

How to apply for the David Ellis Scholarship

Five scholarships of \$500 will be awarded to five high school students who submit a winning essay or video on health and safety themes.

The scholarship is only available to high school students who are the son, daughter or grandchild of a member of the United Steelworkers.

Students may choose between two themes for an **essay** or **video** to be posted on 'YouTube':

- **Spreading the word:** How I would make high school students aware of their risks and their rights in the workplace.
- **How to be a workplace survivor:** My personal experience with health and safety on the job.

Essays must be between 750-1,000 words in French or English. The winning essays will be judged for creativity, style and content.

Essays must be typed and mailed or emailed (email preferred). Each essay must have a cover page with the student's name, high school, home address, home phone number, and email address, as well as the name and union local of the sponsoring member of the Steelworkers. Or, create a three-to-five-minute video. Submit it to 'YouTube' and then email the 'YouTube' link to dellis_scholarship@usw.ca.

Submissions must be post-marked or emailed no later than June 30, 2011. Essays or links to 'YouTube' videos may be sent to:
